



CHLA Peer Navigator Employment Training Program

Interns enrolled in the Peer Navigator Employment Training Program learn the knowledge and skills to provide health care transition services to youth and young adults with disabilities to facilitate the transfer from pediatric to adult-focused health care and access to transition and adult-serving social services from pediatric to adult serving systems. Interns work in a health care setting on site and work directly with patients to receive case management services. The goal of this training program is to assist interns in finding employment in healthcare or social service settings.

Requirements of Peer Navigator Interns Include:

- Have employment goals related to working in health care and social services.
- Eligible for the Paid Internship Program (PIP) at their Regional Center.
- Able to transport themselves or access transportation to the CHLA main campus on Sunset.
- Able to navigate an office space after an orientation
- Work 20 hours/week
